September Chapter Meeting Speaker

Lieutenant Colonel (ret) Donald C. Denmark



Lieutenant Colonel (ret) Don Denmark is a native of Tampa, Florida. He is an atypical soldier in that he served as an enlisted man, a warrant officer and a commissioned officer, in the Army of the United States.

As an army officer Don had a varied career that spanned 27 years of leadership that included command, staff, and line positions. He has an undergraduate degree in aeronautical science from Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, and a graduate degree in Public Administration from Central Michigan University. Don is a graduate of *The Army Command & General Staff College* at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, performing graduate studies in military history, and strategic military/political planning.

He is a former Director of the Civilian Leadership Training Division of the Center for Army Leadership. Don is a graduate of the Department of Defense course "Organizational Leadership for Executives" (OLE). As the Director, his duties included leading analysis projects for the design, development and implementation of organizational structures, and the developmental training for world-wide organizational executives, to include military and civilian proponents.

After his retirement from the Army in 1998, Don branched out into human-resources analysis, design/development and training, and organizational effectiveness analysis. He served as the Principal and CEO of Professional Development Associates for 14 years, and was a lead trainer and construct analyst for the American Management Association. Don has conducted over 4,000 organizational analysis, corporate mentoring programs and construct development protocols, with emphasis on the human resource sectors of analysis, design, development and implementation.

Don holds an array of awards, decorations and badges including the flight wings of a senior army aviator and the jump wings of an army parachutist. He is a 5-time recipient of the United States Army Meritorious Service Medal, and has received the prestigious Department of Defense, Order of the Legion of Merit. As the Professor of Military Science at the University of Kansas, Don was promoted to "Colonel of the Regiment" by the national honor society, The Society of the Scabbard & Blade.

Don retired from business in 2015, and resides with his wife Sandi, on a horse farm near Lawrence, Kansas.
